


After the meeting lan Hahn suggested Nicole visit the Snowy Mountains during her 3 months in Australia. Jane, Morgane and I we met up with Nicole on Thursday night for a quick twilight car tour of Canberra before dinner and planning an Easter Friday ride.

Nicole had been given the use of a F650GS whilst in Australia, so our planned route was Bobeyan Road to Adaminaby before heading up to Cabramurra and down to Khancoban for lunch. ADVENTURE BIKE TRAINING

David Morgan, R1200GS

Last month eight Club members took part in a training course aimed squarely at the larger adventure bike, with our bikes ranging from R1200GSA / GS, F800GS, R100GS and President Martin's Husqvarna 630 (built when BMW owned Husqvarna, Martin makes clear). The course was run by the south coast based, Academy of Off-Road Riding on private property in the Buckenbowra area, roughly 20 kms from Nelligen and Mogo. All eight of us bar Ross, being a local from the coast, camped on site.

Peter, Tim and I arrived Friday late afternoon, whereas Martin and Bob turned up much later, electing to surf the gravel roads and creek crossing to the site in the dark. The remainder of the group arrived

breakfast time, Saturday morning. As did our hosts, Lyndon Heffernan and Steve Pritchard, with our breakfast. The "fully catered" course fee of \$350 included all meals and morning and afternoon teas, from Saturday through to Sunday's lunch. The property was close to the Buckenbowra River, which had a fine swimming hole close to the campsite, which a few found refreshing after warm day in riding gear doing slow speed manoeuvres.

The course commenced 8:30 AM Saturday, with Lyndon giving a brief of the course outline followed by a discourse on adventure bikes and appropriate rider clothing and gear. Following that we mounted and up and followed Steve, on his Yamaha Ténéré, to an open field where the majority of the training was to take place. There, Steve commenced with the first lesson of the day, concerning appropriate stance and position on the bikes standing of course - bringing in teaching points on foot-peg steering, weight distribution, and the like. After demonstrating himself, we all then got to put the instruction into practice around the circuit.

In the course of the practical exercises, Steve would individually assist / advise where required, to ensure that we all had the routines squared away before moving on to the next lesson. Each lesson was essentially a build up to the next in a logical progression. The mornings were a little more challenging at times, especially for bikes with "dualpurpose" tyres, as the damp grass provided much more scope for movement than later in the day. All the exercises done around the training paddock were all at relatively low speed, 40 kph or less. As the last activity of each day, we rode off following Steve to put the day's teaching into practice around some of the gravel roads and fire-trails in the local area. The only casualty off any sort was Simo's F800GS, in which his bike simply stopped and refused to go any further. The problem, suspected to be electrical, was later found to be a fully dead battery. Notwithstanding, Simo was able to continue training using the Academy's Ténéré, once Steve had finished his demonstrations.

Overall, the consensus seemed to be that the course was well run and enjoyed by all who attended. Most importantly, it seemed that no matter what your past experience, all of us went away having learnt new skills and improved on our old skills in this area of our riding. If there's the interest later in 2013, the Club will liaise with the Academy with a view to running the course again specifically for our Club. In any event, the Academy may be scheduling Adventure Bike Training during

END OF ACT REGISTRATION LABELS

The abolition of registration labels has been considered nationally and locally a number of times. WA, SA and Tasmania have recently ceased issuing registration labels and NSW has announced that they will also be abolishing registration labels on 1 January 2013.

As part of the ACT Government's Red Tape Reduction Panel the Government has agreed to abolish registration labels for light vehicles. It is expected that registration labels will no longer be required for light vehicles from 1 July 2013. It should be noted that while registration labels provide an indication that a vehicle is registered; a registration label cannot be relied on as proof of registration. In some instances labels have been found to be fraudulent and there are cases where a person pays for their registration, receives a label and subsequently the payment is dishonoured meaning the vehicle is unregistered but displaying a "current" label. In addition, there are cases where a person pays for their registration and subsequently cancels the registration again meaning the vehicle is unregistered but may continue to display a "current" label. Also, the introduction of the RAPID numberplate identification technology by ACT Policing has resulted in the identification and removal of unregistered vehicles from ACT's roads without relying on registration labels.

Light vehicle owners will continue to receive registration renewal reminder notices and registration certificates, however they will no longer be required to display a registration label on their vehicle.

The Club has moved to a new online home http://bmwmccact.wildapricot.org/

Your complaints, the Webmaster's bloodied & pounded fingers, Treasurer's gnashing of teeth and new Membership Secretary's anticipated joy have been heard. After months of research the Webmaster, supported by the Committee have selected the *Wild Apricot* software platform as our new cyber-home.

Your current membership details have been transferred and your email address is the basis of your online account. A temporary one-use password will be emailed to you directly. Once you have your login and password you can customise your information and update personal details in real time and contact other members directly or collectively.

The Ride Coordinator will update rides and email members directly, whilst the Treasurer can generate invoices (for renewals) automatically with members able to pay directly online, again in real time. In addition, intending members can join online directly to the Membership Secretary. Future options include setting up an online store for Club regalia; members posting their own ride reports and pictures to the webpage and creation of member special interest groups.

The Committee had hoped to use the software for 2013 renewals, however some teething troubles have emerged and whilst swiftly dealt with have meant a mixture of old and new methodologies.

If you have any concerns please email the Webmaster directly but remain positive, patient and understanding.

This software will enhance the Club's on line presence, intended to make your engagement with the Club a more attractive experience and lighten the burden on the Committee charged with operating the Club on your behalf.

13TH COLD FLAME RALLY 2013

This year's 13th *Cold Flame* Rally was back to it's usual spot on the Barry Way - Pinch River intersection under sunny skies, a pleasant change to last years floods that saw the Barry Way closed and rally moved to later in the year. Like some other rallies the *Cold Flame* saw ~40 riders on the Friday night, ~120+ on the Saturday with an unknown number staying on for the Sunday evening as well in part because of the Canberra Day long weekend.

Steve (F800GS), Hal (F650GS) and I left on Saturday morning for the run south

along the Bobeyan Road through Namadgi NP, Berridale and into Jindabyne for lunch. As is often the case, breaks were often taken in company of other riders with Jindabyne's Nugget Crossing bakery doing a steady trade in tourists and locals.

Lunch out of the way and au revoir's to those we would see later, we headed off for the Barry Way. The first 30km of bitumen help clear the head after lunch before the gravel starts. I have taken the 1200ST down this road in the past, so provided you keep out of the washouts and eye on the loose spots, there shouldn't be a reason not to go along. Attested to by the many sports bikes young and old that make it to the *Cold Flame* each year. With Jane not riding under Doctor's orders, I was able to give the F800 a bit more headway as I work on improving my dirt riding ability with a pause a photo opportunity taken at the Wallace Craigie Lookout.

The run down the hill to the Snowy River makes for great riding before joining the Snowy River and run along its banks to the Pinch River campsite and steadily increasing temperature from mid 20's to mid 30's.

Our arrival and early greetings dispensed with, we mad e camp on the top part, with the creek side camping filled with Friday nighter's and what must be weekday apartment dwellers.

Having looked for a Rally with appropriate tree spacing, Steve hung his combination hammock and hutchie as protection from snakes and/or floods. I wasn't clear on which, whilst Hal and I opted for the more conventional tent arrangement.

The domestic arrangements out of the way and in deference to Jane's forced absence I assembled the Helinox

(rather then Kermit) chair and opened a cold one. Crisis! With Jane's absence, I had reorganised the packing routine, putting the chilled beer in a pannier rather than the usual affair; this had resulted in not only one but two beers having sprung a leak. A curse on brewery executives and their quest for ever thinner cans. All was not lost though as I had only lost a ~1/3 of each can, but still I felt the pain – to the web shop!

This travesty called for a swim in the Pinch to cool my fevered brow and the mid afternoon 30+ temperatures; Hal and Steve had the red, cheese and biscuits. And who said rallying was hard yakka?

The afternoon and evening progressed along usual lines of talking, story telling and reliving past, present and proposed future rides into the wee small hours under a clear a star lit night. For reasons unknown I was awake at 4am and gentle snoring and surprisingly quiet campfire chatter, dozing until daylight and clear skies when I resolved to break camp and make the run south to Victoria and McKillops Bridge.

Plenty of likeminded rallyists, fine weather and stories aplenty!

I had never travelled the length of the Barry Way before now, but it certainly wont be the last. The early morning sun cresting the mountains, Snowy River and great road surface made for great riding and stunning scenery.

Coming out at Suggan Buggan I was left with a right turn to Benambra, suggested by Hal and Steve, or continue on turning left before Brumby and McKillops Bridge. I was only just inside the Alpine National Park when a 4WD coming the other way prompted a rapid move left, closely followed and missed by his mate, travelling right up his a@#e or trying to overtake in the dust. Shades of Cape York and the Peninsula Development Road. This precursor to what is known as a narrow road were short lived as they were the only moving vehicles I saw between the Rally and a farm ute on the Bonang Highway before Delegate.

McKillops Bridge is a marvel of engineering, for a purpose not quite clear, but probably explained in the unvisited picnic shelter, to support the long departed forestry and cattle industries. It is well worth the trip and will be revisited in the future. A pocket camera does not do the bridge, mountains, river or vista the justice they deserve.

The run out of McKillops Bridge was equally enjoyable with good gravel roads, great scenery only shared with the grazing cattle, one wallaby and a startled wedge tail eagle picking on a not so fortunate wallaby.

Joining the Bonang Highway, another motorcyclist's must do road, I passed a group of road and adventure BM's in Delegate with a nod and a wave pressing on to Bombala.

I counted ~10 bikes, but there may have been more. Pleasantries out of the way, I continued north to Nimmitabel with the intention of travelling up the Braidwood Road, as advertising obscured my map and road from Bombala; the price of a free map I guess.

This road is also quite good and not too challenging to the new dirt rider, whilst offering opportunities for the more experienced rider. The road was all the more enjoyable with few cars or even bikes.

My final stop was Captains Flat; with the Pub closed (again) and Outsider Café closed, this left the Bowling club & RSL. Served by one, my cold beer & I joined the one patron who confirmed the Servo's closure and unlikely re-opening due to the weight limitations placed on the bridge. A subject of an ACT 730 report, I find it amazing that a Council can get to the point where a bridge falls into a state of disrepair is now seriously jeopardising a communities future.

Palerang Council must share thee same planning skills as Dungog's.

The run home from Captains Flat was made without incident, closing out a weekend of fine riding, great company and stunning scenery. The right hand loop to Benambra will have to wait for another day or 14th Cold Flame in 2014.

Lastly, co-organiser Sue reported with thanks on www.advrider.com, that the rally participants raised \$1280.60 for Prostate Cancer Research from the \$20 entry fee that included a badge and stubby cooler or \$100 note-press for non-drinkers.


