

IMPROVING MEMBER RIDING SKILLS

One of the Club's objectives is to improve club members riding skills. In recent years, the Club has sponsored and organised rider skills training and first aid courses. This year the Committee has adopted a different approach where you book, pay and attend a selected rider-training program and on completion present your 'certificate' to the Treasurer who will reimburse you 45% of the course cost and maximum \$100. Sorry no reimbursement for travel, accommodation, meals or entertainment: only the training course.

- BMW Australia Off Road Rider Training, various locations,
- > Stay Upright ACT @ Sutton,
- Academy of Off Road Riding @ Nelligen
- Top Rider Motorcycle Rider Training @ Marulan, (occasionally in Canberra, check the web).
- California Superbike School (Australia), various race track locations.

In anticipation of the massed enthusiasm, for 2014 the subsidy has a 20-member course cap. We will keep you up to date on where we are at and if you are concerned please email the Treasurer@bmwmccact.org.au before booking your course.

The rules!

- You must be a current financial member of the BMWMCCACT Inc. Yes, we will check.
- You must book, pay and attend a course with one of the rider training organisations listed above.
- You, having successfully completed your course send a copy of your course completion certificate to the Treasurer@bmwmccact.org.au with your contact email and bank details, and
- The Treasurer, having validated your details will then reimburse you \$100 (maximum).
- You can claim only one reimbursement for this program cycle, April 2014 to February 2015AGM.





The Club has purchased a SPOT personal (or group) GPS tracker for financial Club member's limited use.

<u>You</u> will need to provide the response mobile phone number or email address that SPOT uses to communicate too. The Club will not be monitoring the SPOT or responding to any request for assistance.

The Club member borrowing the SPOT is required to leave a refundable cash security deposit of \$50 and also responsible for providing the 4 AAA batteries (if/as required).

The SPOT comes with instructions on its use and preformatted messages.




BEEMER FARKLES¹

This month I thought I would share with you a hard found tech tip. Long-term BMW owners will be familiar with the legendary low maintenance totally enclosed shaft drive within the swingarm connecting gearbox output to final drive housing via a splined drive shaft. Well, on the R1200's the final drive is open at the bottom allowing all manner of road grime to collect and water to wash out the Castrol Optimol Paste sliding spline lubricant. The front is slightly better protected, but nonetheless is open to the lubricant drying out over time. See the pictures courtesy of Real OEM and MaxBMW.

Now I wont bore you with the technical detail on how to remove, clean and lubricate the drive splines, as that's what Haynes manuals, You Tube or your preferred Motorrad dealer is there for, but if your into DIY home maintenance, then add this to one of the must do's when your next changing that 'sealed for life' final drive oil. The recommended lubricant is Castrol Optimol T paste.

Need to find yourself some Castrol Optimol T paste? Then try your friendly BMW spares counter local specialty auto store or any of these after market BMW suppliers <u>Munich Motorcycles</u> (WA), <u>Motor Works</u> (UK), <u>Moto-Bins</u> (UK) that stock and post it.



Now, if you own a chain drive bike like an F800GS you won't need to worry about this, but you will need to clean, adjust & lubricate the chain. Everything comes at a price.

ALTERNATIVE BREAKFAST 2 NOV 14 – SNOWY MOUNTAINS GOURMET CAFÉ

My planned weekend riding to the *Trout Rally* at 3 Mile Dam was cancelled at the last minute by my riding companion and Saturday's forecast of high winds and thunderstorms throughout the Snowy Mountains. Rob's decision was vindicated when those that went endured 4+ hours of heavy cold rain and shivered through a cold night; as much to do with the fact most had packed 'spring' riding kit.

Sunday morning found me pensively gazing out the lounge room window towards Namadgi NP under clear blue skies, bright sun and mild temperatures; perfect Spring riding weather and had me pondering where to ride too.



lan Warren undertakes his pre-flight inspection and adjusts his take-off weight-distribution post 'big breakfast'. Just out of shot are two NSW Highway Patrol vehicles, checking up on returning Snowy Ride participants. As expected everything was in order.

Simo's (R1200GSA LC) call to ask where I was for Sunday's planned ride to Bredbo broke my pondering and that Michael (F800GS) and he were waiting at the Chisholm BP. Righto, give me 10 minutes and I'll meet you there. Having fuelled up and reviewing the planned ride through Namadgi NP, Shannons Flat and across to Bredbo we were joined by Bill 'I don't do dirt' and his R1200RT.

With Bill happy to wait and see if anyone else turned up, the 3 of us headed off to Tharwa and Bobeyan Road passing 2 cars along the way. This road is in excellent condition and before long we had turned off onto Billilingra Road passing a kangaroo, number of smaller wallabies and two goats sporting an impressive set of horns.

IMPRESSIONS OF NORTH EAST USA - A ROAD TRIP

Last September I, and my wife, Jill, toured the North East States of the USA to almost fulfil one of my bigger "bucket list" items. I say almost, as my desire was to see the autumn colours in Vermont but due to pressing BMW Club activities in October (the peak month for seeing the fall) we went in September. We did see some early autumn colours but I may have to visit again to get the complete show. Forget the coloured leaves, tell us about the bike riding I hear you ask, OK, here's my impressions.

After a trans-pacific and transcontinental flight, we arrived in Boston in the fair state of Massachusetts. Boston is famous for those rebellious early settlers who threw a cargo of tea into Boston harbour in 1773. It turns out that the

46 tons of tea poisoned all the fish in Boston harbour for several years thereafter. The harbour and surrounding ocean has recovered and support a large fishing industry, so I ate one of Boston's famous lobster rolls – looked like a shredded king prawn and tasted pretty good. Bostonians are proud of their conservative, Puritan founding fathers and the city has numerous, well-preserved old buildings, a large financial centre and no rubbish or graffiti to be seen. We then boarded our rental car, a black Chrysler 300C, to cruise through the other New England States. I felt a bit like a gangster in this car but it was loaded with technological features and was a very comfortable drive and economical too – 9.0 L/100 km overall.

From Boston we headed south to check out the town of Plymouth and a replica of the Mayflower, as important to the Americans as Cook's Endeavour is to us. From there we visited Battleship Cove, to crawl, duck and trip through the battleship USS Massachusetts, the destroyer USS Joseph P. Kennedy and a submarine, USS Lionfish. I was able to view the "breech end" of the USS Massachusetts 16 inch cannons and marvel at the support infrastructure

required to feed, house and maintain the 115 officers and 1700 men. Jill, surprisingly, grew tired of looking at great grey ships, so we next called into Newport, Rhode Island, sometime home to the Americas Cup and lots of huge stately homes. The traffic there was unbelievable. It is a compact island with narrow streets filled with the usual oversized SUVs and utes competing for road space with helmetless, thong-

wearing hero's riding old minibikes and the smallest scooters and scooter-powered, two seater buggies to be seen. The local Police seemed unconcerned by it all.

The roads in this part of the world come in three varieties; multi-lane, barrier-divided, freeways with 55 to 65 mph speed limits with very wide verges which allow you (not me, because of the vigilant co-pilot) to travel 10mph over the speed limit to cover the gaps between cities easily and quickly. You usually don't get to see anything of interest because of the thick tree growth beyond the verge screens all the scenery. The State Routes are secondary roads and our favourite thoroughfare as these roads wended their way through every major town and numerous minor ones as well. The speed limit on State Rotes varies from 55 to 45 to 30 to 35 to 45mph, often all five speeds in the space of a few miles. Apart from the constant speed changes, the driving was easy and the ever-changing scenery was fantastic. To Australian eyes, North America is very green, the grass is abundant and deep green, the cornfields were mid-green and the tightly packed trees are bright green. Only the well maintained home gardens broke the sea of green with prolific flowerbeds in every colour.

What about the bikes you ask? I did include a visit to the European Motorcycle Day at the Larz Anderson Motor Museum one Sunday. The Museum is located in the outer suburbs of Boston and hosted approximately 240 bikes from several motorcycle clubs and a trade tent filled with Ducati's. The Yankee

Beemers Club had the biggest showing with over 110 BM's ranging in age from the 50s to the latest LC R1200GS. The older bikes; R27, R50 and R69 models were all in concourse condition but most were ridden a moderate distance to the show. I had a great chat to the editor of their club magazine, Dana Lewis, about the challenges clubs face with an ageing rider population, declining membership and the shortage of members willing to join their committee. Some issues seem universal.

Other highlights at the show were several immaculate 70s Bultaco and Ossa trail bikes, a couple of rare Rickman and Seely-framed bikes, a new-perfect Triumph Hurricane triple and a K1100 with an actively suspended sidecar.

The Flexit articulated sidecar is considered by many to be the best engineering solution to the problem of making a sidecar that leans in unison with the motorcycle.
