



Guest Speakers

A general discussion on first aid was given by Peter Snell (ACT Ambulance Service) and Barry Ogden (St. John Ambulance Brigade) spoke briefly on his recommendation that members carry a first aid kit. Peter covered various observations of motorcyclists injuries, usefulness of protective clothing, and how to assist keeping an injured person breathing, stop haemorrhage (bleeding), and bandage broken limbs.

The talk was long and informative, and Peter closed with a suggestion that the Club consider a first aid course at St. John Ambulance be requisite of membership within 6 months of member joining.

Meeting closed without supper due to the time - 10.25 PM, and drinks urn inaccessable - we couldn't use our usual room for the evening.

TOURING by Bob Rumsey

To try to encourage a bit more interest in 'rallying' I have decided to provide you lucky people with my impressions (or opinions) of coming events that I know of.

Feb. 24-26: Sydney Motorcycle Exhibition at Canterbury Race Course is probably the largest and most comprehensive motorcycle show in Australia. Manufacturers and trade displays of all the new models, accessories, equipment and services available for motorcyclists will be there. Quite aspectacle and well worth the trip.

March 3-4: Ellenborough Falls Rally at Elands in the mountains above Taree on the central north coast (about 160km north of Newcastle), is generally a good, orderly affair with some catering. Many scenic routes can be taken to the site which is approachable only by dirt roads. Of course, Ellenborough Falls nearby is well worth seeing.

April 20-23: Revs Bathurst Easter Rally at Ben Chifley Dam within 20km of Mt Panorama was first run last year. I heard it was a quiet turn out with many family groups present in a pleasant camping spot. Cars are allowed and entry fee entitles you to a discount on the races entry charge.

April. 20-23: The Australian GP Races at Mt Panorama are an 'instution' in the australian motorcycle scene. Some of the best road racing in the world is to be seen here and the well travelled tourer can be assured of meeting up with many interstate acquaintances in the crowd. Behaviour of both the 'bikie' types and the police is usually harmless while the races are in progress. However there can be serious trouble from either group at other times, especially at night.

As a veteran of 11 consecutive 'Bathursts' and having camped there for the last five years it is my opinion that there may be big trouble this year on the mountain. The police have extended their fortifications and the mob will be out for revenge after last year's riot.

Bystanders are not exempt from being arrested by police and/or beaten up by either group. If you do go, stay away from the police compound and don't take vehicles (especially cars) near any crowds of people. I won't be camping there.

June 9-11: The Alpine Rally at Brindabella is only 80km away but the trip can be a nightmare for some. As Paul Giles (organiser) said last year after the road being snow covered; "the idea of rallying is to teach a bloke how to ride a motorbike". If you want to learn to ride and camp out in difficult conditions then this rally can be good value. It can also be an easy run, depending on the weather.

Always remember that rallies held near the larger cities generally suffer from the antics of ratbags. Roaring around in the dark (drunk with no mufflers on) is popular around Sydney so be careful where you set up camp. Petrol bombs are more the go down south.

The February club run attracted seven starters despite the early meeting time (8am). We left Philip in nice, clear weather and headed for a regrouping in Braidwood, arriving there after a short demonstration of the excellent roadside servicability of a certain R90S. That's a smart way of saying "it broke down".

Coffee at the waterfront cafe in Bateman's Bay was very pleasant even though the weather had turned to overcast

and cool (typical south coast).

After some refuelling we set off along the coast road to Malua Bay where we had our BBQ lunch by the beach. This is a good spot for lunch as there are adequate BBQs tables and shelters, a take away food shop and grog shop nearby and no passing traffic.

We continued on through Mossy Point and Bruolee to return to the 'Bay' via the Princes Hwy which has some rather good winding sections now that they've upgraded it. After more coffee in Braidwood we all arrived back in

Canberra quite early. Shows what can be done when you get an early start.

On the recent long weekend I attended the Australia Day Rally in the Chichester State Forest near Dungog. It was a fairly small turn out and, as usual, a bit damp. Fortunately I didn't stay Sunday night when there was two inches of rain.

There was a good gymkhana on Sunday, the most interesting event being the backwards race. The procedure is to run backwards across a huge mud patch, pick up your bike off its side stand and push it backwards across the mud to where you started. The guy with the R80/7 won.

STOP PRESS (Saturday 18 Feb.)

Just this morning I have been riding the new K100RS. As they say, it has amazing torque and it seems to have a lower center of gravity than the boxers. Its very easy to forget that you're in top gear though, especially coming up to a corner.

The one I rode had quite a lot of vibration below 3000 revs but smoothed out over that. The fairing looks deceptively small from the rider's position but is very effective at over 100km/h. Therewas no noticable turbulance at over 130 km/h.

Thanks to Doug Bryant for the ride.

Well, as a lot of you will know by now, I have purchased Brian Bleming's previous bike (which is an R80ST, not an R80GS, as reported elsewhere.) I took delivery of the bike from Doug Bryant's at the beginning of the year, (Brian had traded it on his new K100) and so I thought that I would take it on the club's first run of the year.

Out on the road with the bike running well and Frank trying to work out all the new switches and instruments, what do you use a clock for? (Obviously not for getting to the meeting point on time..Ed.)

Time soon passed and me coming into Cooma, and out again, not thinking of stopping 'till I reached Angler's Reach. Just as I was nearing the turn off to the Snowy Mt.s Highway, I came across a K100 travelling into Cooma like a low flying F111! (Chris suggested later that it may have been Brian as he had come on the run as far as Cooma to see some friends who live just south of there.)

On the Snowy Mt.s Highway I pulled over to put on the wet weather gear as it looked like it may rain, however I saw little of it by the time I arrived at Adaminaby where I stopped for some fuel. I pressed on to Angler's Reach and found Chris & Anne Fulker, Werner & Ursula Strotmann, Doug Bryant, with Helen, Family & friend in tow, already settled in and admiring the scenery.

After getting the tent set up I started to prepare my lunch, oh no; not beans again!

After lunch I tried boiling the billy on the BBQ, gave up and got into hot water from Chris, sorry, I mean I was given some hot water by Chris. We all sat around the (Bush) picnic table near the BBQ with our cups of tea and coffee or whatever and talked about the day so far, the pleasant location that the Strotmann's had for their van and so on. (this is when I mentioned that I had seen the K100 mentioned earlier.)

When we had all finished our brews and had a look about the area Chris took the R65 Doug had ridden down from Canberra and went for a ride around to the Old Adaminaby township, so I took my trusty R80ST for a run and followed behind him, after all, there might have been someone from the 'I Would Like To Own A Harley, Club' out to ambush him......

We checked out the village and headed back to our campsite, keeping a sharp watch out for the 'IWLTOAH, Club along the way, we probably scared them off by superior numbers,..... On returning Chris gave back the R65 to Doug and went off to pack the R60/6 for his return home.

A while after Chris and Anne had left I spent an hour with some help from Doug trying to stop my tent from blowing away. (The tent is blowing in the wind, by Frank and Doug, ? a new hit song...?)

Saturday night was spent in Werner's caravan with what was left of the group drinking wine and telling fishing (Fishy?) stories, then it was off to the tent, still standing, for a night's sleep. I slept in (AGAIN! Ed.) and missed the fishing trip, but got up in time to see Bob Rumsey arrive on his R80/7. After a morning of coffee/tea and bike stories, it was time to pack up and ride home.

The trip back to Canberra was in good weather with people losing each other but somehow still ending up coming in to Canberra together.

A nice bike on a nice trip to a nice place, now it would be nice to arrive in time to leave with everyone else, must see if I can do it some time...... the end.

R80ST.

At the last meeting (Feb.) we had a speaker from the St. Johns Ambulance Brigade who spoke about the various ways motorcyclists can help themselves and others if involved in an accident. One of the points raised was that all our members should be encouraged to do a First aid course with St. Johns, or a similar body like the Red Cross, and to carry a suitable first aid kit when riding, especially on long trips.

For those of us that do not yet own K100s or late model R series bikes with the standard BMW first aid kit included, Barry Ogden (Dept. of Aviation officer responsible for checking F/A kits carried in/or approved for/aircraft in Australia.) has made a list of suitable items for a motorcycle F/A kit, the list was prepared for most situations that could be encountered in general motorcycle related accidents, and has left out bottled products that would be damaged in a fall or by rough roads etc.

The list is as follows:-

4 Triangular bandages	2 #14 wound dressings			
1 7.5 cm X 2.5 m cotton crepe bandage				
10 cotton buds	10 adhesive dressings (band aids)			
1 5cm X 1.5 m conforming elastic bandage				
1 small pkt. tissues	8 Panadol (foil wrapped)			
1 Tweezers	1 pr. Tullen kitchen snips			
1 eye bath (plastic)	1 note book and pencil (small)			

A suitable bag to carry these items would be the resealable plastic bags with the strip along the top, or a small travel bag for shaving gear that has a water-proof lining, with a large red cross on the outside for easy identification.

Other items could be added to the list if a particular situation was likely, ie sunburn or insect bites on a long trip.

We thank Barry for his time in preparing the list and for attending the meeting with Peter Snell from the A.C.T. Ambulance Service. Everyone present appreciated their comments and most learned some thing helpful.

If interested members could contact Mark we may arrange a course for club members to attend in a group.

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Seeing as you are in the mood to spend....



shoing the various items, for you to look through.)









