

RECOLLECTIONS OF ORAN PARK

The weekend 28th/29th March included test rides on various BMW motorcycles. And as the brochure said "these ride-days are not a speed-oriented event - those hoping to break the lap record may be disappointed. The circuit is being used to provide a safe venue away from the distraction of Sydney traffic."

Not only the N.S.W. residents were interested in attending, and about 10 A.C.T. club members made the journey up to partake of this unique opportunity. Following are recollections of some of those who went.

FRANK MILLWOOD

My ride up was on Sunday morning, starting at about 12 noon, arriving at Oran Park just after 2 p.m. The bike was playing up a bit, and just before Camden I had to clean out the carbies. This showed water in the fuel, possibly picked up at a recent fill-up.

A ride on the R80RT felt great, however I didn't like the way the handlebars were positioned, because the angle of the bars made a 90 angle of the palm, which felt quite uncomfortable. The shape of the bars themselves was the cause, not the position of the controls. It seemed as if the only way to fix this would be to change the bars.

The R80GS Paris-Dakar mudguard is very high. It felt a bit like a sail with the wind catching it, making the front feel light. The large petrol tank seemed to spread my legs a bit and with a bit of shuffling during the ride I found that the only way to fix things in order to feel more comfortable was to sit further back, which felt unnatural. What would have been better for me would be to change the tank for a smaller one.

The organisation of the day was good. I also had a ride on the R65 - great - no complaints about that except that it needed a bit more power, something like a R80 engine!

Our return (with Fran, Warren and Kath) was relieved by a "traditional" drink at the Berrimah pub and at Goulburn we split, with Kath returning on the R60 to Queanbeyan and us tackling the high winds on the Federal Highway.

CHRIS FULKER

After much decision making I chose to leave for Oran Park on Friday night so that I wouldn't meet up with the Saturday morning rush. Conveniently, my brother allowed me to stay at his place at Campbelltown which is near Narellan and Oran Park. After a peaceful night's sleep and an early breakfast I arrived at the Park at about Despite overnight rain the day was fine and the track was dry by the time I arrived (with the exception of one corner). checked in at the control point and met up with several of the BMW Australia reps, John Fairman and others, and members from the N.S.W. BMW Club who were assisting with the administration. The rides were scheduled from 9.30 onward and some of the early risers were already out circulating on the track, although it seemed fairly quiet at that There were some early morning dramas with a couple of the test ride bikes, the first being an R80 that wasn't running well and after some discussion we tried swapping spark plug leads which showed that one had failed. Rather than withdraw the bike for the day we pinched, (borrowed) the high tension lead from a Paris Dakar display bike from the Rent-a-BMW rep from Sydney, until a replacement one was brought Not long after that there was some commotion from the pits which

turned out to be the first skirmish with the track. Apparently, a Highly Dangerous rider had taken a K75 out and on about the third bend had confused the foot controls which locked up the back wheel. In the ensuing panic he grabbed a fistful of front brake, overshot the corner and slid off into the grass, damaging his pride and the front fairing of the bike and putting it out of commission for the rest of the weekend. Although it was rideable, the BMW reps chose not to let it be used, causing a major reshuffle of the booking schedules. A spare KlOORS was pressed into service to make up the numbers.

Also, very late on Saturday afternoon, an inexperienced rider went off the track on an R80, causing minor damage to the bike, but the rider was taken to hospital with abrasions and bruises (no broken bones). Test rides were delayed until another ambulance returned to the track. Note that both riders who fell off were not wearing jackets, despite requests for protective gear to be worn.

I generally made myself useful by assisting with refuelling the bikes at lunchtimes, etc., and during the quieter periods I managed to get a few rides on various models. Sunday I assisted by marshalling on the far side of the track and later circulating on track as travelling marshall. Trackside marshalls placed on the far side of the circuit ensured that on Sunday there was no repeat of Saturday's incidents. The go-fast boys were suitably deterred.

Overall the weekend was quite successful and the 'pre-booked' programme meant the smooth flow of test rides without long queues for the 18-20 test bikes, provided by BMW Australia and several NSW dealers. The weather for the weekend was excellent, being fine and sunny with a slight breeze. Temperatures were about 20°C.

I wanted to get back to Canberra before dark so left the track about 3.30 to 4 o'clock, heading off down the freeway in light traffic but very windy conditions. I enjoyed the weekend and hope BMW Australia will put on another test ride day sometime in the future. Many thanks to BMW and the various dealers, and the NSW Club.

FRAN and WARREN GILCHRIST

The weekend was very well organised by the BMW Touring Club of NSW and the BMW dealers, and supported by the company. Oran Park was a good choice as it is a great place to ride around. After a couple of laps you automatically get the lie in the corners, and experience the freedom of open acceleration while knowing exactly where you are going and what you can do apart from the Sunday drivers. Warren went for test rides on K100RS, K100RT and R80RT. The RS was wonderful! Also, the RT was wonderful and handled just as well two-up. Continental Super Twin tyres on the K100RT gave confident steering and excellent grip without being over-soft rubber. The R80 felt very 'agricultural' and perhaps it wasn't tuned correctly. It also wobbled, especially in the s's.

We, together with Kath whom we had ridden up with from Quean-beyan, spent some time checking out the entries in the Concourse, noting the variations in mounting side cars. It seemed as if there could have been a difference of hundredweight between the brackets on the lightest and the heaviest mountings. There were some fine examples of restored BMWs from the 30s and 40s in the Concourse, with fine books being given to all section winners and a trophy to the overall winner (unfortunately, the carefully written down details of his bike and name have been misplaced but Kath will include it next month if it surfaces from her papers or handbag - her words).

KATHLEEN PHILLIPS


Although Warren and I hadn't booked any rides on the Saturday we decided to go to Oran Park for a look-see anyway. case of "Did you bring a map?" at the garage where we filled up, to which I replied, "No. That's considered to be cheating, isn't it?" Our noses led us via the Bungendore road to Goulburn, surprising Fran and Warren with the beauty of the route and the reasonable condition of variously twisting and straight road.

I had booked rides on the R80RT and the Paris Dakar but I scored a ride on Saturday on the R65 as a "warm up" due to a booked rider not showing for his ride. The keepers of the booking charts and the minders of the various bikes were extremely flexible about this and Warren and I enjoyed an extra ride each on Sunday by standing by to take advantage of a lull in the rides of the R80RT. Only two laps each, but a chance to experience another model. We calculate that between 500 and 600 rides per day were had, with much exchange of opinions between riders in the pits. I personally am now a Paris Dakar fan, probably feeling an affinity between that and my R60, and am saving my small change for the 'big day'. The R80RT seemed unstable to me, certainly not because of the fairing which I am used to having on my own bike, and this impression was shared by others. The R65 felt great. I commend the organisers for a well-run and enjoyable weekend.

Warren and I had a go at taking some photos and if the one taken of the 'Gilchrist Racing Team' turns out, it might prove a

goodie for the competition in November.

"BUZZED, BOMBED & BOTHERED BY BUNDANOON BLOWIES"

Seems I always manage to pick the worst w'end for camping. Either it's so cold that not even the electric gloves can cope or it's the other extreme. That certainly proved to be the case on the w'end that Fiona and I had chosen to spend wandering around Bundanoon at the northern edge of Morton National Park. It was also an excuse to try out some new camping gear, but really 37° is not such a comfortable temperature to be breaking in a new leather jacket.

It was no use calling it off though as Chris Fulker was coming along for a day run and was expected at any moment. We had decided to try the alternative route to Goulburn as the Lake George goat track is a tad boring and now that the Bungendore, Tarago, Lake Bathurst road is sealed all the way it makes a pleasant change and is only some 15 km further.

Thanks to Chris' excellent bushman's skills we were led to the coolest spot in Goulburn which just happened to be the site of a well known Scottish restaurant (he doesn't wear a Swiss army knife for nothing, folks!). So, suitably refreshed with McFries & McDiet McCokes the intrepid trio ventured forth once more into the blazing McSun in search of McBundanoon.

Buzzed cont....

The camping area is well sited though fairly small with only 8 sites which need to be pre-booked and paid for in advance at Fitzroy Falls as there is no permanent Ranger Station at Bundanoon. Unfortunately, the area is intended more for the campervan/caravan set which for us meant pitching the tent on a small patch of greenery adjacent to our designated site or risk bending all our pegs. Showers are adequate rather than 5 Star and need to be fed 20¢ pieces.

After a brief rest and the downing of copious quantities of liquid we bade a fond farewell to Chris and spent the rest of the afternoon in search of shade and still more liquid in a vain attempt at replacing fluid loss while every fly within 100km was searching for a landing strip on all the exposed, frantically waving limbs.

It was agreed that early evening would be the only safe time to stroll as the mercury might have dropped a little by then.

The Bundanoon section of Morton National Park has a variety of walks. There are steep tracks for the energetic explorer as well as short strolls to spectacular lookouts. The first easy walk we tried was to Erith coal mine which is a forty minute round trip from the camping area. The mine was opened in the early 1860s by the Sydney Melbourne Land & Coal Company. The main tunnel is 450 metres in length and branches into sub-drives. The seam was approximately one metre thick but of poor quality. The coal was hoisted in skips about 25 metres to a staging area directly above the mine entrance. Today, for safety reasons fencing prevents entry into the mine.

As the temperature dropped with the setting sun so our energy returned and we decided to take a look into Glow Worm Glen (no, it's not the name of some legendary Bush Ranger!). The glow worms are only visible at night. The National Parks information sheet proclaims that this trek is a "20 minute easy walk" - it took us twice that long, down lots of quite steep steps, although we only had an ailing torch to guide us. The same sheet mentions that reflective markers point the way - unfortunately not on the night we were there, perhaps local wombats have souvenired them all and have taken to wearing them as a road safety measure. All these gripes aside, it was well worth the effort and certainly seemed a popular spot judging by the number of other 'stumblers' we passed on the way.

Sunday blistered into life with the same ferocity as the previous day so a vote was taken and the decision made to break camp and leave Bundanoon to the ever-present hordes of aggressive insects. Once packed, in record time, we checked out echo, echo, point, point for a final glimpse of the magnificent vistas this area has to offer before beating a hasty retreat. A wise move as even at that early hour the heat could be felt rising from the earth.


Liquid replenishment stops were made in Goulburn and Bungendore, where we downed a couple of 'Red Back Spiders' before arriving home.
