

TJ'S TYRE COMPETITION RULES

In order to encourage more members to participate in the TJ's competition, it has been decided to change the criteria. The prize is a set of tyres for your bike and donated by Hal Caston of TJ's Motorcycle Tyres & Accessories. There will be two competitions as below.

- 1. Highest kilometres travelled irrespective of the number of bikes used.
- 2. Closest to average kilometres travelled.

Example: Rider One rides 2 bikes. He submits the kilometres on the 2 bikes and they count as one entry as he has done the kilometres. One has done 12,000 km and the other 9,000 km. So, Rider One has done a total of 21,000 km but he has only one entry

Rider Two also has 2 bikes. 1 does 500 km and the other 18,000 km. - a total of 18,500 km. Rider Three has 3 bikes, which the total kilometres add up to 34,000 km. This results in a total of 73,500 km, which is divided by 3 entrant's results and gives an average of 24,500 km.

So, Rider One with 21,000 km is the closest and wins the prize.

It is accepted that not every member undertakes or wants to undertake extended bike journeys but nevertheless in the course of the year covers a high mileage in normal or less lengthy trips.

On 1st November, you should submit the odometer readings for all bikes nominated. This figure will be used as the starting point for the following year. (Reminders will be given in the Newsletter).

CHRISTMAS IN WINTER BEECHWORTH 2010

Viv and I rode out of Canberra via the Uriarra Crossing and then onto Mountain Creek Road. The short stretch of gravel was extremely slippery following the previous days rains, so that was a wake up call. Hard work with a pillion on the back! At the Wee Jasper junction, we headed back to Yass and then jumped onto the Freeway down to Gundagai, stopping at Barneys Café at Bookham for a warming coffee. Barneys is a

relatively new café very close to the freeway and was worth the stop.

At Gundagai, it was back onto the rural roads, where we headed for Tumbarumba via Tumut and Batlow. We passed Jimbo's and Lou's bikes parked in the Shell servo at South Gundagai, no sign of the riders. Not too much traffic for a workday had us making good progress, although the climb up Laurel Hill slowed us down a tad, it was freezing, plus the roads were still wet from the morning drizzle. Fuelling up at Tumbarumba, it was a mild 6 degrees at 12:30pm. Lunch was at the 4 Bears Café, where we were joined by El Presidente, Greg Oakes and Roger Paull.

From here, it was that great ride to Jingellic, followed by the River Highway to Granya Gap, then

onto Tallangatta for a short break, before pressing onto Beechworth via Yackandandah. Well that was the plan, but Roger knew of a back road near Kiewa that we should take, so in the best GS tradition we took the scenic route (got lost temporarily) before popping out somewhere south of Yackandandah. From there, it was a short gallop into Beechworth to check into our accommodation and suss out dinner spots.

Dinner that night saw our table winning its share of the local SES raffle.

Saturday was a slow day, with very heavy fog blanketing the township until mid morning. This was all the excuse I needed to spend a few hours drinking coffee and eating a slow breakfast. This was closely followed by some serious shopping, and then a token ride on the bike out to Chiltern and Rutherglen. Lou

There was some excitement on the roadworks on the climb up the hill, the gravel looked firm and dry, but dry it wasn't and it was a quick transition down to a lower gear and speed.



These next three data sheets cover the introduction of the motorcycles, which saved the BMW motorcycle division. If these did not sell, there would be a very sad day for the motorcycle division of BMW. These were the R 50,60 and 75.

These models were a complete rethink of the BMW motorcycle. There was only one major thing that was left the same as the old model. This was the horizontally opposed air-cooled twin engine. There was one or two small items not changed and they were things like the ignition switch, the carden drive, the twin leading shoe front brake and the single leading shoe rear brake. Also If you take into account that the telescopic forks which appeared on the R69 in America the year before that we did not see here, otherwise every other thing was changed.

Looking at the motor first. A starter motor was fitted on the top of the entirely new motor casing and the camshaft was moved to under the crankshaft. The ignition system was changed to a battery coil system and the electrics were powered by a 3-phase alternator with an external rectifier and regulator.

The R50 had mm slide carburettors. The R 50, 60 and 75 were exactly the same so we will continue these notes on the next two sheets.
