

Hi,

Boy, things have been busy the last month or so. Haven't done much riding around here, but did do some around South Carolina and the neighbouring states in the US.

Was visiting some friends, Dave and Lynn, over there, who I know from the Californian BMW bike club days; turned out to be great timing, Dave had just bought a second bike just a few days before I arrived (a pristine K75C with under 7k miles on it) so I got to ride that. My first time in that part of the world and was really impressed by it. The size of the ranges is similar to the Great Divide around the Victorian Alps, but it's a lot more extensive, so many roads that snake along them. Highlights were the Blue Ridge Parkway and Deals Gap. The Blue Ridge goes along the top of a range, one lane in each direction, with no crossroads, lights or signs on it. Really beautiful scenery. Deals Gap is a motorbike Mecca, with, as they say, 318 curves in 11 miles. Did that section in both directions and by the end of the day, I think I had done the most number of corners and curves in any single day of riding.

Interesting that like all the villages and towns around here, there are war memorials. Though the ones over there are all commemorating a particular war, as the locals call it, the war of northern aggression, ie the American Civil war. Seems like they haven't really gotten over it yet, in spite of this year being the 150th anniversary of the start of it.

Anyway, as I said, some great roads and scenery over there, plus really friendly people, so well worth a trip if you get the opportunity. Also got to check out the BMW factory at Spartanburg, where they used to make the Z4. The new ones with the folding hard top are made in Germany, along with the convertible 3 series. Given that I just bought a 2006 Z4, was nice to see where it was made.

MOTORCYCLE RIDER AGE AND RISK OF FATAL INJURY

This is an extract from the Australian Transport Safety Bureau Monograph 12 *Motorcycle Safety* published October 2002 and accessed here http://www.infrastructure.gov.au/roads/safety/publications/2002/pdf/Mcycle Age 1.pdf.

Key Findings

- Fatalities among riders aged 17 and over decreased by around 6 per cent between 1991 and 2001 while over the same period fatalities among riders 40 years and over increased by 77 per cent.
- Fatalities among riders 40 years and over as a proportion of all rider fatalities, increased from 14 per cent in 1991 to 27 per cent in 2001.
- The popularity of motorcycling appears to be increasing significantly among the 40 years and over age group.
- Despite the significant increase in older rider fatalities,

the risk of fatal injury to motorcycle riders per distance travelled is still significantly higher among younger riders.

• Motorcycle riders are around 29 times more likely to be fatally injured than operators of other vehicles travelling the same distance.

Conclusion

The data presented suggest two key motorcycle safety issues. One is the issue of increasing fatalities among older motorcycle riders. While older riders have the lowest fatality rates based on kilometres ridden, the rate of increase in fatalities among this age group is the highest. Older rider fatalities are becoming a steadily increasing proportion of motorcycle fatalities.

Part of this increase in fatalities is due to an increase in motorcycle riding among the 40 years and over age group. This is most likely a result of the combination of an increase in the general population of people 40 years and over and an increase in the popularity of motorcycles among this age group.

Even when increased exposure is taken into account, the rate of older rider fatalities is rising at a greater rate than might be expected. If the number of people 40 years and over taking up motorcycle riding continues to rise, the problem of motorcycle safety among this age group is likely to become an increasingly important issue.

The second issue is the continuing poor record of younger riders. Younger riders are still at significantly higher risk of fatal injury than older riders. Although the overall number of fatalities has decreased among riders between 17 and 25 years, their rates are still significantly higher than older riders. Rates among the 26 to 39 year group are also significantly higher than older riders. There is also evidence suggesting that, fatality rates per vehicle kilometres travelled among these ages are actually increasing.

YERRANDERIE RIDE, 28-29 MAY 2011

Six of us took the overnight ride to Yerranderie located at the headwaters of Lake Burrendong (Warragamba Dam) Martin (R1200GS), Andrew (R1200GSA), John (R1150GS), Rob (R1220GS) and Matt (R1200GS).

A cool and foggy morning saw us leave Watson on time and ride to Gunning until breaking free of the fog into bright sunshine just before Crookwell. After warming up at the bakery, it was on to Taralga and light dirt to get us in the mood.

The stretch from Taralga, Bumford Ford and up the (Abercrombie-Oberon) hill to the turn off was made in quick time, with little traffic, before reaching the turn-off. Yerranderie is located within the Blue Mountains NP and catchment of Warragamba Dam. The 60km of dirt road was in very good condition, some of the best I have ever seen within a NP, saw us arrive around 3pm. Pausing to regroup

and having lost two, Andrew rode back to find Martin & John who had found a creek crossing with a deep hole. Fortunately, the only damage to John was water ingress and a broken pannier bracket repaired later that evening using some heritage items and assorted cable ties.

Yerranderie is a private town that was sold to NP's in March 2011. Whilst its future and access is unclear, there are a range of accommodation options including camping (\$12), basic (\$33) and lodge (\$44). Keeping with the GS reputation it was the lodge for us except Martin, who has an image to uphold. The only others

were some 4WD campers.

The Lodger's moved in, walkers walked, repair crew set to work and all settled down for the evening. Early evening saw us retire to the Lodge's lounge and fire, before Martin decided to join us. This was fortunate, as our fire was looking decidedly ill until Martin applied his Sea Scout fire setting skills. The evening progressed with robust discussion on many and varied topics.


Morning broke with light cloud and the promise of a return ride via Oberon and Tuena. John made an early start and headed home, whilst the rest variously breakfasted, packed up and took the short walk to the ruins of the Silver Peak Mine. At its height Yerranderie was home to some 2000 people before a combination of industrial unrest, depression and falling silver price saw the town decline from the late 1920's. Scott the caretaker opened the museum and provided a backdrop story to the mining, town and history.

Having taken our fill, we left for the return leg and made good time up the hill and back to the bitumen. The last 15kms was made in light showers and temperature steadily dropping before regrouping. A group decision as

taken to ride to Oberon for lunch and fuel, before abandoning the Tuena route and dirt. With continuing showers, we headed back to Goulbourn via the Taralga road, coming back into the sun on the Taralga side of Abercrombie River.

With little traffic, good time was made into Goulbourn, where Andrew left us for the Hume and home.





The diminished group continued on the back road to Taralga and Bungendore making it all the way to Chisholm before splitting up and home.

An excellent ride, even by car, and well worth the effort before the two year moratorium ends on the status quo for Yerranderie. The next trip will include the Kanangra Walls and Jenolan Caves loop.

NATIONAL ROAD SAFETY STRATEGY 2011 - 2020

Wonder what the Department of Infrastructure and Transport have been pondering over summer in respect of motorcyclists and motorcycling? From the draft *National Road Safety Strategy 2011-2020*:

SAFE ROADS, SAFE SPEEDS, SAFE VEHICLES and SAFE PEOPLE

On average, four people are killed and 80 are seriously injured every day on Australia's roads. Almost everyone has, at some stage, been affected by a road crash.

Australian Transport Ministers have asked the heads of transport and roads agencies around the country to work together to prepare a new 10-year National Road Safety Strategy for the period from 2011 to 2020. The new strategy is intended to set an ambitious long-term vision for road safety improvement in Australia and to guide national action over the coming decade.

Transport agencies developed a draft National Road Safety Strategy that was released for public consultation on 1 December 2010.

- Investigate the potential for all motorcycles to be equipped with Anti-lock Braking Systems (ABS).
- Introduce regulation to improve stability, traction and braking on motorcycles.
- Introduce a GLS (graduated licence scheme) for motorcyclists including those returning to motorcycling after some years
- Develop a national rating program to assess motorcycle helmets (and potentially other protective gear for safety) to promote market demand for safer helmets.
- By 2020, introduce greater use of effective helmets and protective gear by motorcyclists.
- Road improvements for motorcyclists, cyclists, pedestrians, older road-users and users of public transport will be a focus.
- Introducing motorcycle black spot and black link programs in all States and Territories, possibly funded by a levy for (on? Editor) motorcyclists.
- Applying technology to ensure speeding motorcyclists are detected.




